## TWO ROCKS SEA WRACK COMMUNITY SURVEY



## **OUTCOMES**

Excess sea wrack (seagrass and seaweed) often accumulates along Two Rocks Beach, immediately south of the Two Rocks Marina.

Feedback was sought from the community to help inform the City of Wanneroo's decision on the preferred option to manage the sea wrack.

A community survey was undertaken between 20 December 2022 and 28 February 2023.



## 98 COMMUNITY MEMBERS RESPONDED TO THE SURVEY 78% WERE TWO ROCKS RESIDENTS.

The survey sought the community's input on various options of action regarding the sea wrack.



of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the City should investigate the development of a community sea wrack collection point.



of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the City should investigate burying the sea wrack in front of the dune to create a foredune.



of respondents disagreed or strongly disagreed that the City should do nothing and let the sea wrack clear naturally.

## **NEXT STEPS**



The City will investigate all necessary approvals and safety requirements for the development of a Sea Wrack Community Collection Point.



Following advice from the Department of Transport, the City plans to bury any excess sea wrack, that is not collected by the community, in front of the existing dune system.



This will create a foredune, promoting the growth of dune vegetation. This will improve biodiversity in the area and provide additional coastal protection.

This approach ensures that the sea wrack remains within the local ecosystem which limits the disruption to the existing nutrient cycle.
