Stop by the Wanneroo, Clarkson, Girrawheen or Yanchep/Two Rocks libraries to grab your official activity booklet and join the quest.

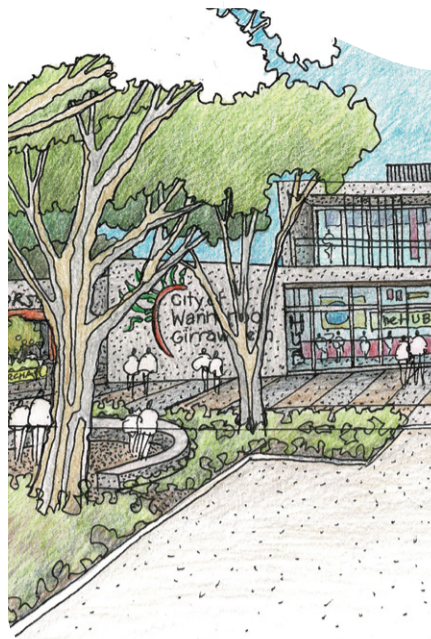

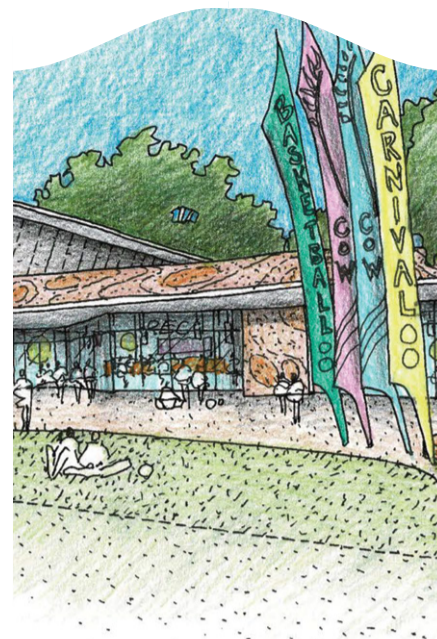

Putting community first with funding call

The City of Wanneroo is calling for government support to deliver vital community infrastructure in Alkimos, Girrawheen and Wanneroo.

Ahead of the 2025 State and Federal elections, we're advocating for investment in three essential community facilities: Alkimos Regional Open Space, Girrawheen Hub Precinct and Wanneroo Recreation Precinct.

These projects will enhance liveability for local people, cater for

the rapid growth of the area and ensure our region thrives.

Redevelopment of the Girrawheen Hub will create an accessible multi-purpose precinct that incorporates the existing uses of the hub, library, community centre and community garden.

Upgrading the existing Wanneroo Recreation Centre will establish a Precinct that includes a co-located Sports Hub and Community Hub.

Constructing Alkimos Regional

Open Space will deliver regional level sporting facilities and amenities including courts, playing fields, pavilions, playgrounds, a community purpose site and a dog exercise area.

Council has committed to spending \$43.3 million on these key projects, but we need State and Federal government support to bring these projects to fruition.

Walk in the steps of the Seven Sisters at Wanneroo Regional Gallery

This multi-sensory installation is based on the National Museum of Australia's internationally acclaimed exhibition, Songlines: Tracking the Seven Sisters.

Songlines map the routes of Ancestral beings as they travelled across Australia, creating the land and its people.

Walking Through a Songline allows visitors to experience immersive light projections that create representations of songlines, exploring the history of the country, as told by artists, custodians and traditional owners.

A series of Seven Sister story works are also on display, loaned

from the Kerry Stokes Collection, Janet Holmes á Court Collection and Gilbert George Collection.

The exhibition runs until 1 February 2025 at the Wanneroo Regional Gallery, Wednesdays to Saturdays, 10am-4pm.
