## Girrawheen Hub Precinct - have your say

Share your feedback on concept designs for the Girrawheen Hub Precinct redevelopment before Monday, 12 May.

Identified as a priority project by Council last year, the Girrawheen Hub Precinct forms part of the City's 'Putting Community First' advocacy campaign, which aims to secure support from all levels of government to deliver vital community infrastructure.

The concept design incorporates the existing hub, senior citizens centre, library, community centre and community garden functions, and provides greater accessibility

across the facility and improved flow between indoor and outdoor spaces.

The redevelopment will also provide increased floor space for external service providers based at the hub, more car parking, expanded parklands and a new outdoor event space.

Mayor Linda Aitken said the innovative concept design would deliver a more accessible and inviting community facility for residents of Girrawheen and surrounds.

"Redeveloping the Precinct will give our community a more welcoming and convenient place to connect

with one another, and to access important services closer to home," she said.

"I encourage people to share their thoughts on the concept design to help ensure the hub meets the needs and aspirations of our community."

Findings from the consultation will be presented to Council.

Construction on the redevelopment is scheduled to begin in January 2026.
